STORING EXPRESSED MILK. Store in breast milk storage bags or clean, food-grade containers. Make sure the containers are made of glass or plastic and have tight fitting lids. Do not store breast milk in disposable bottle liners or plastic bags that are not intended for storing breast milk.

Storage Bags special plastic retains breastmilk's beneficial properties. Leak-proof, easy-to-close zipper top. Place smaller bags inside a larger food storage bag to prevent accidental punctures. Freeze milk in 2 to 5 oz portions. Small amounts will thaw more quickly. You will waste less milk this way and will avoid over-feed-ing. Liquids .

Use breast milk storage bags or clean, food-grade containers to store expressed breast milk. Make sure the containers are made of glass or plastic and have tight fitting lids. Never store breast milk in disposable bottle liners or plastic bags that are not intended for storing breast milk.

You might start with 2 to 4 ounces (60 to 120 milliliters), and then adjust as needed. Also consider storing smaller portions — 1 to 2 ounces (30 to 60 milliliters) — for unexpected situations or delays in regular feedings. Breast milk expands as it freezes, so don't fill containers to the brim. How do you store breast milk in a container?

Containers you can use to store milk include: Glass is the first choice for breast milk storage. It preserves the components of milk the best. But glass breaks, so keep in mind that some daycare centers won't allow it. Hard-sided plastic containers are the second-choice alternative for breast milk storage.

How long can breast milk be stored?

Never store breast milk in disposable bottle liners or plastic bags that are not intended for storing breast milk. Freshly expressed or pumped milk can be stored: At room temperature (77°F or colder) for up to 4 hours. In the refrigerator for up to 4 days. In the freezer for about 6 months is best; up to 12 months is acceptable.

What is the best way to store milk?

Hand washing, using clean or new containers, minimizing milk transfers (which waste fat and calories), and pumping directly into storage containers are recommended. Plastic or glass containers are fine, no evidence supports one over the other. Cold storage.

How do you store breast milk if you have a shared pump?

If using a shared pump, clean pump dials, power switch, and countertop with a disinfectant wipe. Use breast milk storage bags or clean, food-grade containers to store expressed breast milk. Make sure the containers are made of glass or plastic and have tight fitting lids.

Can breast milk be stored in the refrigerator or freezer?

Do not store breast milk in the door of the refrigerator or freezer. Storing it further inside will help protect the breast milk from temperature changes when the door opens and closes. If you don't think you will use freshly expressed breast milk within 4 days, freeze it right away. This will help to protect the quality of the breast milk.

How do you store expressed milk?

If you're storing expressed milk at your baby's child care facility, add your baby's name to the label. Place the containers in the back of the refrigerator or freezer, where the temperature is the coolest. If you don't have access to a refrigerator or freezer, store the milk temporarily in an insulated cooler with ice packs.
