Where is Pitcairn Island?

Pitcairn Island, isolated volcanic island in the south-central Pacific Ocean, 1,350 miles (2,170 km) southeast of Tahiti. It is the only inhabited island of the British overseas territory of Pitcairn, Henderson, Ducie, and Oeno Islands, which is commonly referred to as the Pitcairn Islands or as Pitcairn.

How many islands are in Pitcairn Islands?

Pitcairn Islands comprises of a group of 4 small volcanic islands including Pitcairn proper, Henderson, Ducie and Oeno Islands encompassing several hundred miles in the Pacific Ocean. Out of these 4-island groups, Pitcairn is the 2 nd largest and the archipelago's only inhabited island.

What is Pitcairn Island famous for?

Pitcairn Island: The largest and only inhabited island, Pitcairn, rises majestically from the crystalline waters of the Pacific. Characterized by steep cliffs, verdant valleys, and pristine beaches, Pitcairn Island captivates visitors with its breathtaking vistas and untouched beauty.

How big is Pitcairn Island?

The four islands— Pitcairn, Henderson, Ducie and Oeno —are scattered across several hundred kilometres of ocean and have a combined land area of about 47 square kilometres (18 square miles). Henderson Island accounts for 86% of the land area, but only Pitcairn Island is inhabited.

What is the largest island in the Pitcairn Islands?

Henderson Island is the largest island and accounts for 67% of the total land area of the island territory. It is an uplifted coral island and is entirely untouched by humans. The highest point on the Pitcairn Islands is the Pawala Valley Ridge with an elevation of 1,138ft (347m). The lowest point is the Pacific Ocean (0m).

Who inhabited Pitcairn Island?

The presence of stone tools, burial sites, petroglyphs, and other artifacts indicates that Pitcairn Island had been inhabited, probably by Polynesians, before its discovery by European explorers. The British ship HMS Swallow found the island in 1767, and its captain, Philip Carteret, named it Pitcairn for the sailor who first sighted it.

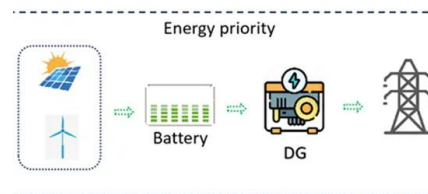


Geography of the Pitcairn Islands

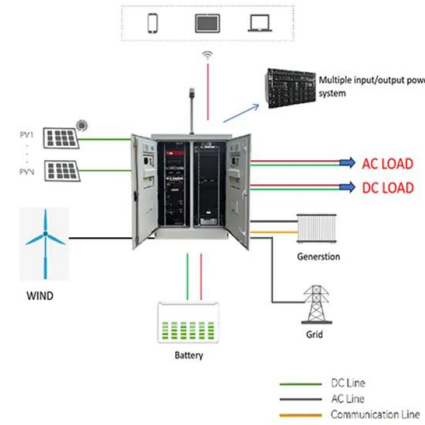
Pitcairn Islands

Polynesians were the first inhabitants of the Pitcairn Islands, but the islands were uninhabited by the time they were discovered by Europeans in 1606. Pitcairn Island was rediscovered by British explorer Philip CARTERET in 1767, although he incorrectly plotted the coordinates. In 1789, Fletcher CHRISTIAN led a mutiny on the HMS Bounty and
