These fake companies may request a large upfront deposit and then disappear before ever completing any work.

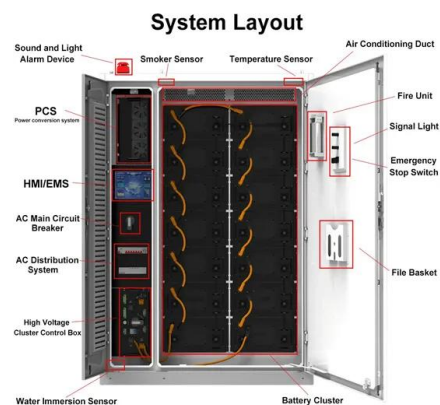

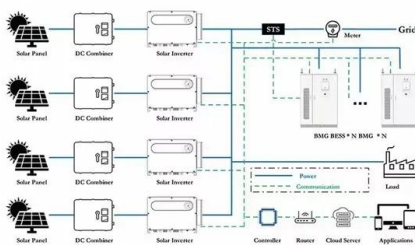
